External Validation at Narrandera High School

Each year, a group of NSW Department of Education schools are nominated to participate in an external validation process. The external validation process provides an assurance to our school and system that the progress being made aligns with the expectations articulated in the School Excellence Framework (SEF). Once in a five year cycle each school undergoes an external validation of the evidence of their school's self-assessment of progress by an independent panel. This panel includes a peer Principal and a Principal (School Leadership) from outside our network.

I will provide feedback to the Narrandera High community on the findings of the panel on our next newsletter. 

NSW Department of Education - School Infrastructure

Works notification

Dear community member,

The Department of Education Compliance & Safety team is conducting state-wide inspections as part of the Asbestos Resurvey Program. Round 1 of this program is scheduled for October 2020 and involves a total of 102 schools across NSW.

This is a proactive inspection program to verify the presence and condition of asbestos containing material on school sites and update the Asbestos Register accordingly.

During October you may see contractors at your local school wearing protective clothing such as high visibility vests, coveralls, gloves and footwear which are a regulatory requirement. The health, safety, and well-being of the school and the local community is our highest priority. Please be assured these inspections will not pose a risk to the local community.

The community will be notified if an area requires attention or remediation.
