### Narrandera High School

It has been a busy fortnight at Narrandera High with all junior and HSC students engaged in examinations. Yearly Exams will finish for students in Years 7-10 at the end of this week whilst our Stage 6 students conclude HSC Examinations on November 11.

#### **External Validation**

Once in a five year cycle each NSW Department of Education school undergoes an external validation of their school's self- assessment of progress by an independent panel made up of a Principal



and a Principal, School Leadership from outside of our network.

Last Tuesday, October 27, Narrandera High School's panel report was delivered based on the expectations articulated in the School Excellence Framework (SEF).

The feedback received about our school and progress was outstanding. Narrandera High was validated as excelling, which is the highest level on the School Excellence Framework, in the following areas: learning culture, wellbeing, data skills and use, learning and development, educational leadership and school resources. All other areas were assessed as sustaining and growing and no areas were judged as delivering or working towards.

The panel's description of our school as a 'lighthouse school' is wonderful affirmation for our entire school community and sets a fantastic stepping stone moving forward.

The panel made comment about our outstanding focus on building a positive learning culture, individualised learning and intervention and having a clear culture of school improvement which is backed by significant improvements in student learning growth, increasing enrolments and quality teaching practice. The school's focus on evidence-based improvement was also recognised. Knowing each of our students well and creating an environment where every student is known, valued and cared for was also validated. Our above average 'value add' between years 7-9 and again in years 9-12 was also praised. The effective use of school resources, both



human and physical was also made mention with Narrandera High being a leader in terms of innovative supports and initiatives such as our Intervention Centre, Aboriginal Learning and Engagement Centre and Clontarf Academy.

The significant improvements in relation to student attendance and the reduction in student suspensions also validated the judgment of 'excelling' in relation to wellbeing.

Part of this process also involved the school identifying future directions to support school improvement. Our school has identified the following elements as areas for future growth:

- Continue to prioritise the use of innovative strategies to encourage high expectations of students and families (learning culture).
- Maintain momentum and growth in relation to improving student attendance and devising effective strategies to engage high-risk students at school (learning culture).
- Increase the number of students in the top two bands of NAPLAN by further enhancing the focus on high expectations, student success and the explicit teaching of literacy and numeracy (student performance measures).
- Continue to provide more opportunities for teaching staff to model and view the most effective and evidence- based teaching strategies (effective classroom practice).
- Continue to increase the confidence of all teaching staff in their understanding of data concepts and the ability to independently analyse student data to plan and modify their teaching practice (data skills and use).
- Continue to strive for and embed a culture of high expectations closely aligned to student progress and achievement across the whole staff (educational leadership).

Thank you to our executive team who led the preparation of our External Validation submission in such a thorough, dedicated and reflective manner. Thanks are also extended to Miss Emily Brooke who assisted in the preparation of the Wellbeing evidence set. Such quality practice and feedback can only occur as a result of the hard work of our entire staff and school community. Thank you to everyone for your ongoing support of our school. I will continue to update you all on our new Strate-gic Improvement Plan as work on this continues this term. Feedback on our Situational Analysis has already been gratefully received from our staff, P&C and AECG (Aboriginal Education Consultative Group).
