Dear Narrandera High Families,

The term continues to progress very quickly at Narrandera High School. There are many important activities taking place at our school over the next few weeks and it is vitally important that all students are at school each day, unless unwell or on other urgent leave.

## All students are expected - and will be supported - to be at school every day.

Improving student attendance and increasing the numbers of students with an attendance rate over 90% will continue to be a priority this term. Research indicates a strong correlation between attendance and long term educational, social and health outcomes for young people. Staff will be contacting families as required to encourage increased attendance. Your support around this initiative is very much appreciated.

# **Junior Yearly Examinations**

All students in Years 7-10 will be completing yearly examinations next week and the week after (November 1 – November 12). A timetable for these exams is included as part of this newsletter. If students are sick on the day of an exam, parents should contact the school as a matter of priority, preferably before the exam is scheduled. Students should be preparing for these exams now.

# **Check In Assessments**

This week and next, all students in Years 7, 8 and 9 will be completing online 'check in' assessments in reading and numeracy. All students in Department of Education schools across the state will be completing these assessments. The data will be used by staff to assess how students are progressing and to plan for future teaching and learning.

## **Delayed Rollover to New Academic Year**

As a result of the HSC Exams being pushed back (HSC Exams do not commence until Week 6, T4 – 9 November) our 'rollover' to our new academic year will also be pushed back until Week 8 (November 22). This is necessary as the Year 11 students will be completing HSC exams up until this time. As Term 4 is an 11-week term, all year groups will still have 4 weeks of the new academic year in 2021.

## Stage 6 Update

We are looking forward to farewelling Year 12 this Friday at their final assembly. Due to COVID restrictions, the assembly will be restricted to Stage 6 students and staff only. The assembly, however, will be professionally livestreamed for all families to view. The 2022 new student leaders (Captains and Prefects) will also be announced and badged at this event. The link to the livestream will be emailed to families this week. The assembly will commence at 11.15am sharp.

After this Friday, all Stage 6 students are not required at school until the rollover (November 22) unless completing a HSC Exam.





# Year 12 Final Fundraiser – This Thursday 28 October

This Thursday Year 12 will be holding their final fundraiser in support of their local charities – Narrandera Can-Assist and Narrandera Hospital Auxiliary. All students are able to wear casual clothes on this day, for a gold coin donation. The students are also hosting a Butler's auction and a car wash to boost their fundraising efforts. # Please read the following in relation to Covid vaccinations.

NSW Health states that routine administration of a COVID-19 vaccine on the same day as any other vaccine is not recommended. The preferred <u>minimal</u> interval between receipt of COVID-19 vaccine and any other vaccine is <u>7 days</u>. Considering these recommendations, the date Year 7 students are now scheduled to receive their 2nd dose Gardisal (HPV vaccine) is the 27th of October 2021 at Narrandera High School. Therefore, any students in Year 7 that receives a COVID-19 vaccine on or after the 20th of



October 2021 will not be able to receive their routine 2nd dose of Gardisal (HPV vaccine) on the 27th of October at the school vaccination clinic. They will need to attend their GP 7 days following receipt of the COVID-19 vaccine or as soon as possible thereafter to receive it.

# **HSC Exam advice**

We know our students and staff have worked hard for the HSC. The safety of our students and staff remains of utmost importance. This year extra arrangements are in place to ensure that any disruption due to COVID-19 will have minimal impact on HSC exams.

Our school has put in place a number of contingencies to help ensure exams run as smoothly as possible.

The exams have been scheduled and our school has arrangements in place for exams to proceed as planned. It is important that students review their timetable and plan well so they turn up for their exams on time, healthy and rested.

Any student with a pre-existing condition, that presents similarly to flu-like symptoms, should be planning now and speak to their doctor/GP. The GP can provide a medical certificate ahead of the exams to ensure they are not sent home. If on the day of the exam your child feels unwell or if any member of your family is unwell with flu-like symptoms, they should stay home and get tested.

It's important to note that all students will be asked upon arrival if they have any flu-like symptoms or if they should be in self-isolation under direction by NSW Health before entering exam rooms.

To minimise the risk of transmission students will be asked to comply with the following:

- Wash hands or use hand sanitiser before starting the exam (hygiene supplies will be available at all exams including hand sanitiser and wipes)
- Masks must be worn during the exam and at the exam site
- Maintain good personal hygiene practices during the exam including covering your cough or sneeze with your elbow or a tissue, and disposing of tissues at the end of the exam.
- Avoid shaking hands or hugging other students on exam days

All students must make certain they arrive at least 20 minutes prior to the exam and complete the sign -in form. On this form students will be asked if they have any flu-like symptoms, they will also be asked to provide contact details.

# STAGE 6 — HSC

We want all our students to sit their exams but sometimes things happen. If your child is unwell and misses their exam, contact the school. Students who are unwell will be eligible for the illness and misadventure provision with NESA.

If there are any changes to exam arrangements we will communicate with HSC students as soon as possible through **email**, **phone text and Facebook**. The school has identified two alternative exam locations in the event that the exams are unable to proceed at school. The alternative locations are listed below:

CRC Hall – 35 Bolton Street, Narrandera NSW 2700 &
Narrandera Public School – Corner Douglas and Adams Street, Narrandera NSW 2700

These are a backup only. Students should attend the exams at the school unless advised otherwise. Email will be the preferred type of communication for these types of notifications. If in doubt, please call the school.

We wish all our students well in the upcoming exams.



# PARENTS & CITIZENS ASSOCIATION


The Narrandera High School P & C Committee are inviting all interested parents and community members to be part of this integral school organisation in 2022.

# School Travel for 2022



# 2022 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2022 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for a school travel pass for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, or who have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details before **the end of term 4**. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications and current entitlements are updated and remain valid. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2022.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

# School Student Transport Scheme site change

On 1 October 2021 the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) information and application portal was moved to **transportnsw.info**. This will assist families to find all their travel information in the one place.

# Travel from Term 1 2022

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) open at the start of Term 4 2021 for travel in 2022, so parents/students can <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a difficult period for local bus operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations increasingly difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel on a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their local bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Please also remember that students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the <u>Student code of conduct</u> and <u>Opal terms of use</u>.
