Student Attendance and Rewards

Student attendance is a key priority for the NSW Department of Education and Narrandera High School. Regular attendance at school is fundamental to student learning. Students who attend school regularly are more likely to achieve





educational success, and increase their career and life options. The Department of Education have set a student attendance rate of above 90% as the expectation.

To further assist with improving student attendance, and in line with our Strategic Improvement Plan activities for term 2, the following attendance reward initiatives will be happening throughout the remainder of this term:

- Shared BBQ lunch- Students with at or above 90% attendance over weeks 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 will enjoy a shared BBQ lunch on Thursday 24th June. More details will follow closer to the time.
- Attendance Champions- The year group with the best percentage attendance over the previous week will be let out 10 minutes early at recess every Monday.
- Individual Case-Managed Rewards Year Advisors and members of the senior executive will be working with individual students to improve their attendance. Individual goals will be set and reaching goals will result in a canteen voucher reward for targeted students.

If your child's attendance rate is below 90% your child's Year Advisor or a member of the senior executive will make contact, with the focus on working together to ensure attendance improvement Your support in relation to this priority is greatly appreciated.

HSC Minimum Standards Testing for Year 10 Students

Students who wish to receive a HSC are now required to demonstrate a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy. This is done by completing three online tests (Reading, Writing and Numeracy).

Students may access these tests from Year 10. A number of our Year 10 students have already met the minimum standard by successfully completing the online tests in Term 1. Those students who are yet to meet the minimum standard will have another opportunity to sit these tests next week (Week 9) before attending Work Experience in Week 10. It is important that all students are at school and on time, so these tests can be completed.

As per our welfare and behaviour procedures, students who have been on two Step 2's or have received a Step 3 or a Suspension this term are not able to attend as this is a non-compulsory school activity.



Dear Parents/Carers

I write to share my recent concerns regarding students smoking, including electronic cigarettes (vaping).

Students have been observed smoking/vaping in and around school grounds, inside the buildings as well as on transport to and from school.

Smoking, which now includes the use of electronic cigarettes (vaping) has been prohibited on all school premises and in administrative areas since July 1988. Smoking/vaping is also prohibited at all public transport stops and stations in NSW and on transport to and from school

Health risks

Smoking is a major risk factor for a variety of diseases and conditions including:

- Coronary heart disease: 10 times higher risk than non-smokers
- Stroke and peripheral vascular disease
- Lung cancer: 20 times higher than non-smokers
- Other cancers such as stomach, bladder, mouth and cervical cancer
- Emphysema
- Osteoporosis
- Type 2 diabetes and metabolic syndrome.

Electronic cigarettes (E-cigarettes) can contain high levels of nicotine. Adolescence is a critical period for brain development and exposure to nicotine can have long-term health consequences, impacting memory, attention and learning.

E-cigarettes are often available in different flavours which can be appealing to young people and may expose them to chemicals and toxins such as formaldehyde, heavy metals, particulate matter and flavouring, at levels that have the potential to cause adverse health effects.

Second-hand smoke exposure can cause disease and premature death in children and adults who do smoke. Specifically children exposed to second-hand smoke experience a range of upper and lower respiratory illnesses and symptoms such as colds and flue, cough, phlegm production, wheezing and pneumonia.

We will continue to take appropriate opportunities to promote the Department's policy on smoking on school premises. We will also report any breaches of outdoor smoking bans to NSW Health.

There are ways you can help protect your children. These include:

- Talking to your child about why smoking/vaping are harmful for them. It is never too late to have the conversation.
- Learning about the different types of e-cigarettes available and the risks associated with using these products
- Setting a good example by being tobacco free.
- Reporting those who are selling cigarettes and e-cigarettes to minors. You can do this by calling the Tobacco Information Line on 1800 357 412

Please contact the school if you have any particular concerns for your child and help will be made available.


