Welcome back to Term 3. I hope that families had some time to spend together and that our students and staff enjoyed some well-earned rest and relaxation over the school holiday period. Term 3 is the final term for our Year 12 students and we wish all of Stage 6 the very best as they prepare to complete their internal assessment calendar, including their Trial HSC exams this term.

This term is also an important term for students moving from Year 10 and Year 11 into the HSC years as well as students moving from Year 8 into Year 9, selecting elective subjects for the first time. There will be a number of important information sessions that will impact on these students and families over the next few weeks. The first of these will take place this Wednesday 1 August at 7pm in the school library. This Stage 6 Subject Selection Information Evening is targeted towards Year 10 and Year 11 students and their families. It is very important that all students and their carers attend if at all possible. Students will receive their Subject Selection Information Booklet and Subject Selection Survey Forms on the night. They will also listen to vital information about the HSC, ATAR and subject selection process. This year, we will be aiming to guide students in their subject selection process more fully by having individual interviews with each student in Year 10 and 11. These interviews will be conducted by the Year Advisor or a member of the School Executive Team. These interviews will take place after students have completed their initial 'survey selections' but before the final selections are submitted.

This Friday, 3 August we will celebrate our annual NAIDOC Day. This day will involve all students from Narrandera High as well as Years 5 and 6 from Narrandera Public School and Year 6 from St Joseph's Narrandera. Students will engage in alternative activities based on immersing them in traditional Aboriginal culture. Elders from our Aboriginal community will be attending and running activities. We will also have former NHS student and GWS Star, Zac Williams in attendance. We are all very excited about this event. Students are requested to wear sports uniform on this day.

This term we will also be busy preparing to welcome our Year 7, 2019 cohort. Our final 'Hands On High School' night will be held in Week 4, Wednesday 15 August, in the school library. Thank you to the parents that have already submitted enrolment packages for 2019. If you are intending to enrol your son or daughter at NHS in 2019, please submit an enrolment form as soon as possible. This will greatly assist our staff planning and timetable preparation. We are excited about welcoming a very large Year 7 cohort for 2019.

Term 3 will also see some staffing changes at our school. Mr Bryant has accepted a secondment to State Office which will involve him assisting schools with Finance. This will mean that I will be Relieving Principal for the term. Mrs Helen Langley will be relieving as Deputy Principal and Mr Dave Kroek will be the Head Teacher – Mathematics. Mr Peter Davies will also move into the Year 9 Advisor role. Thank you to Helen, Dave and Peter for taking on this extra responsibility for the benefit of our school. It is extremely reassuring to have such a capable and committed staff at Narrandera High School.
